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2005 Annual Meeting Preview

Dear VOS Colleagues,

I would like to invite you to the annual meeting this year at the beautiful Homestead Resort in Hot Springs, Virginia. We are very fortunate to have Dr. Christian Gerber from Zurich, Switzerland as our invited guest speaker Friday night to give his perspective as to the differences between Orthopaedic surgery practiced in Europe and what he has experienced in the United States. Also new this year, we will institute Resident scholarships to financially support residents, increasing attendance and improving the quality of the scientific program. As usual, we will have a Saturday afternoon golf outing on the renowned Cascades course. A hosted a cocktail reception Saturday evening that you won't want to miss. With all that the Homestead has to offer, this should be a very special weekend. I look forward to seeing you and your family there.

The Homestead Hot Springs, VA

The Homestead, built in 1892, adjacent to the original hot springs has attracted weary travelers since the 1600's, this notable site became a renowned mecca for those gentlemen and ladies who sought peace, relaxation and the curative properties of the famed mineral spring waters in a genteel, restorative atmosphere. Today, this magnificent Historic Landmark has been carefully restored to its original classical appearance. Time seems to stand still as you step onto the broad portico. But step across the threshold and you will begin to experience the exciting changes in store for you.

The grand scale of this imposing four-story building is apparent as you take in the railed balcony high above the Reception Area. Graceful Victorian-style lighting casts a soft glow around the room and over the polished hardwood floors below. On the top story you will find the Spa Salon, a full service salon that offers the best in men's and women's hairstyling, manicures, pedicures and skin care therapies such as the Luxury Facial, a traditional experience in relaxation and cleansing. Innovative skin treatments such as Alpha-Lifting with AHA and an Oxygenating Treatment are also available. Here you may purchase many of the products used in your hair, facial and nail treatments. Next door, you'll find the Fitness Center, complete with Cybex equipment, treadmills, steppers and stationary cycles, and the Aerobics Room, where exercise and yoga classes are held. Located on the ground floor are the spectacular Indoor Pool, fed by the naturally heated mineral waters of the Spa's hot springs, and the heated Outdoor Pool. An old-fashioned parlor-style Snack Bar rounds out the conveniences on this floor.

Whether you decide to spend an hour or a day with us, you will join generations of travelers who have found relaxation, revitalization and rejuvenation in an incomparable setting at our historic but timeless Homestead Spa.

Recreational Activities

The Homestead maintains a stable of over 50 horses, and offers English and Western style riding. Enjoy a trail ride through the forest, or try a leisurely carriage ride at twilight in an antique buckboard or fringetopped surrey, pulled by one of our beautiful teams. Some of the carriages date back to the early 1900's, and have been lovingly restored by our own carriage maker. With over 100 miles of



forest trails to choose from, horseback and carriage rides remain two of the many country pleasures you can enjoy at The Homestead. And just opened is our new Equestrian Center, with modernized facilities for horses and staff.

Tennis

The Homestead has six courts, including four Har-Tru courts and two all-weather courts. Two tiers of courts are laid out to give your game privacy plus a spectacular view of The Homestead tower and the mountain valley. In season (mid-March to mid-November), the teaching program is under the direction of Peter Burwash International, whose philosophy is to teach individuals not systems. In season, your playing options are many and are designed to accommodate all ages and skill levels. You may participate in a daily clinic, take a private lesson or rent a court to play with family or friends.

Swimming

The Homestead Spa boasts beautiful Indoor and Outdoor Pools. The magnificent Indoor Pool was built in 1903 and is fed by the naturally warm mineral water of the nearby hot springs. It is open year round. The adjacent Outdoor Pool was added in 1954 and is open seasonally.

Hiking & Biking

One hundred miles of hiking trails wind over our 15,000 acres of

mountains and valleys. As you walk along the beautiful and serene forest and stream areas, you will have the opportunity to see many gray and red squirrels, a variety of birds, and if you are quiet enough, you may see some whitetail deer or wild turkeys. There are three self-guided trails as well as a guided hike through the Cascades Gorge.

Fly Fishing The Cascades Stream Few mountain streams are as scenic and productive as our four-mile-long

trout stream that flows between the Cascades and Lower Cascades Golf Courses. Accented by a series of beautiful waterfalls, this clear running stream with its wealth of mountain wildflowers and greenery qualifies as a magnificent challenge to the novice and experienced fly fisherman.

Falconry

Known as the "sport of kings," falconry is one of the oldest of the field sports with a history that stretches back nearly 4000 years. Learn about this unique form of hunting with trained birds of prey, including falcons, hawks and owls, at The Homestead's Mews. Beginner and intermediate lessons are available. At the conclusion of the lesson, the guest is given the opportunity to be photographed with the bird.



The Shooting Club

The Homestead Shooting Club, surrounded by laurel and ringed with mountains, is one of the most challenging and scenic shooting facilities anywhere in the United States. In 1993, the facility was redesigned and a third course built to host major tournaments such as the U.S. Open and the annual Homestead Cup. The course's diversified presentation of targets is unequaled anywhere. The Homestead Shooting Club offers sporting clays, 5-stand sporting, skeet, trap and a .22 caliber rifle range. 
Other Activities For Kids
